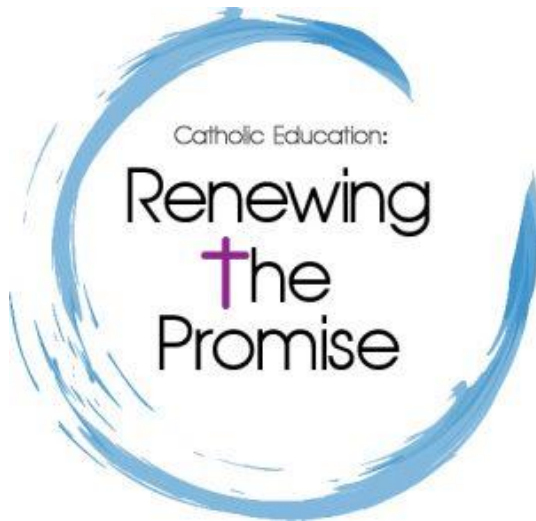




Catholic Education: Renewing the Promise

2018 CARFLEO Conference:

“Restoring Right Relationships: Continuing the Pilgrimage towards Truth and Reconciliation”



CARFLEO held its annual conference on March 22nd and 23rd, 2018. This year our theme was ***Restoring Right Relationships: Continuing the Pilgrimage towards Truth and Reconciliation***”.

Stan Fontaine, our facilitator, reflected on the teaching of the Seven Teachings of the Anishinaabe – wisdom, love, respect, bravery, honesty, humility, and truth. As we

moved through the Seven Teachings, Stan reflected on personal stories, faith stories; he connected each of the Seven Teachings to the indigenous spirituality, creation, and day-to-day life.

Stan’s second presentation was on the Medicine Wheel. Through the use of the Medicine Wheel we journeyed through:

- Human development of the physical, spiritual, emotional and mind. He invited us to:
 - take care of ourselves spiritually;
 - to do an emotional clean-up;
 - to renew the mind with positive thoughts;
 - take care of the physical body; and,
 - practice the teachings – it begins with the heart
- Family:
 - Embrace positive values for family life
 - Nurture each other;
 - Practice good communication;
 - Be active together; and,
 - Consecrate our family to God
- Community: leadership, economic, socio-cultural and spiritual
 - Practice spiritual principles – set a solid foundation
 - Build healthy relationships and be culturally competent
 - Share! Share your time, talent and treasure (\$) with others
 - Be a responsible leader and call others to be good leaders
- Evangelization:
 - Pray and be a witness to the faith – live it
 - Celebrate your faith
 - Learn and know the faith
 - Share you faith, start by serving others

Stan Fontaine's presentations helped us to appreciate the richness and wisdom of the Indigenous People. He helped us to reconnect with our Catholic faith and to merge this faith with aspects of Indigenous culture.

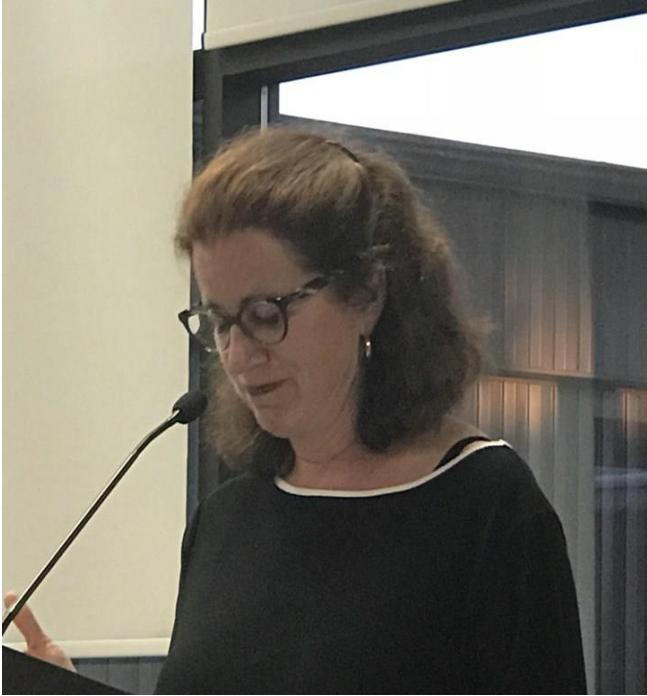

At our annual CARFLEO conference, following our opening dinner and Evening Prayer liturgy, CARFLEO Awards were presented to the following recipients:

Archbishop Philip Pocock Award for Excellence in Religious Education:



The Archbishop Pocock Award is awarded annually to honour an educator who has made outstanding contributions to the field of Religious Education here in Ontario. This year the award was presented to Deirdre Thomas. Deirdre was nominated by Peter Crane.

Deirdre has been an advocate for Catholic Education for over thirty years. She has excelled in a number of roles including Religion and Family Life Consultant in Eastern Ontario, Ontario English Catholic Teachers Association (OECTA)/Ontario Catholic Schools Trustees' Association (OCSTA) Religion Course Director and Superintendent of Education responsible for Religion and Family Life for Peterborough Victoria Northumberland and Clarington Catholic School Board. Other contributions include sitting on

various leadership committees including Institute for Catholic Education and OCSOA.

It is very interesting to note that Deirdre was on the original intermediate writing team with the National Office of Religious Education Program, "Stand by Me" series. She has stayed the course and is presently a member of the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO) committee for implementing the new "Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ" program. For a number of years Deirdre was also an active member of *Catholic Religious Education Consultants of Ontario (CRECO)*.

Today there are no plans for retirement as she continues to advance the cause of Catholic Education. Deirdre continues her great work in Catholic Education as part of the editorial team for "*Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ*" and as a member of the ACBO committee for implementation of this elementary program.

Deirdre is a tireless worker for the Diocese of Peterborough in her capacity as Assistant to the Bishop, as well as responsibilities for Marriage preparation coordination and chairperson for the new Parish based sacramental program.

Father Angus MacDougall Award for Excellence in Family Life Education:



The Father Angus MacDougall Award is awarded annually to a person who has made outstanding contributions to the field of Family Life Education. This year's award was presented to Kelly Pickard-Lefterys, Religious Education, Family Life, Adult Faith, and Equity Consultant for the York Catholic District School Board. Kelly was nominated by Diane Murgaski, Acting Director of Education (York Catholic District School Board).

A natural leader and gifted educator, Kelly has made significant contributions to Family Life Education both locally and provincially. She has prepared numerous inservices, documents, videos and resources for the implementation of the 2015 HPE Resources for Elementary and Secondary Religious Education, Family

Life, and Physical Education. Kelly has extensive knowledge of best practices in Family Life Education, and she has assisted many educators to become more informed and more skilled at addressing a wide variety of Family Life topics. Her confident and joyful approach has succeeded in "converting" many teachers who may have initially been hesitant to teach Family Life, and she leads by example in her willingness to provide articulate and faith-filled responses to potentially challenging questions. .

Kelly works diligently to promote equity and inclusivity through Gospel messages of belonging and acceptance. She demonstrates a deep commitment to honouring the dignity of the human person and the sanctity of human life. She is a valued member of York Catholic District School Board's Religion and Family Life Team.

Key Contributions:

-- Kelly was a central person for the delivery of Health and Phys Ed and Family Life Inservices for York Catholic District School Board and the Catholic Principals Council of Ontario with regards to supporting LGBTTTQQ students and staff. In her work with CPCO & LGBTTTQQ supports and inservice, she was able to work with administrators both in English and in French.

-- In the past year, Kelly has been engaged as a writer/ editor for the new Grade 9 Secondary Religious Education Resources being prepared for September 2018 implementation throughout the province.

-- Kelly is currently the Chair of York Catholic District School Board's EREAC – Elementary Religious Education Advisory Committee. EREAC is comprised of YCDSB's stakeholders including the Local Bishop, Clergy, Lay Pastoral Staff, OECTA, Parents, Teachers, and School Administration. One of the roles of this committee is to initiate and sustain opportunities for growth of quality education throughout York Catholic District School Board.

-- Kelly has worked with the CCC on projects including ShareLife lessons and lessons for Leprosy Mission Canada. .

Kelly is an essential contributor to effective inservice in Religious Education and Family Life both at YCDSB, throughout the province, and nationally.

CARFLEO SECRETARY

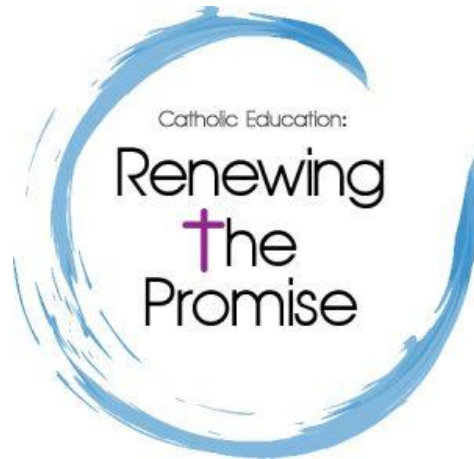
